Review all available data, service trends and needs to inform and support annual local planning, strategic priority setting, and continuous service improvement




Growing National Challenges



HOMELESSNESS

18% of people who are in shelters have a developmental disability according to Dr. Sylvan Roy, PhD, President, Ontario **Psychological Association**





50% live with significant medical issues according to Health Care Access Research and Developmental Disabilities

Women with a developmental 90% live below the poverty disability are 65% more likely line to experience abuse



- About 100,000 Ontario adults have a developmental disability. An estimated 40% (40,000) of these people also have a concurrent mental health diagnosis
- An estimated 14,000 Ontario individuals with an intellectual disability are on a non-municipal waiting list for residential housing with a projected 40 year waiting list

Our Ask

Our aim is to improve the availability and affordability of housing for individuals with developmental disabilities.

HOW

Federal Government

- federal investments through coinvestment fund reflect current day costs
- establish a dedicated pathway for deeply affordable and supportive housing for the Developmental Services Sector

accordingly.



Provincial Government

• Provincial investment in housing for people with developmenal disabilities earmarking 10% of the National Housing Strategy funding to this critical need AND, requiring municipalities to commit

Municipal

- Partner with local agencies serving those with developmental disabilities to quickly build more housing
- Establish an equitable assignment of land, funds, and resources for affordable, accessible and supportive housing for individuals with developmental disabilities
- Ensure favourable zoning to allow for more inclusive communities providing affordable, accessible and supportive housing.
