






#### **COVID-19 Laboratory Tests and Percent Positivity** in Durham Region























 Local wastewater data is no longer available due to the wind down of the provincial Wastewater Surveillance Initiative




















Figure 1. Current wastewater COVID-19 viral activity levels in Canada



#### Confirmed Influenza Cases in Durham Region





















#### **Active Durham Region Outbreaks** in Institutional Settings

Under the Health Promotion and Protection Act, Durham Region Health Department is required to respond to reports of suspected and confirmed outbreaks of gastroenteritis and respiratory illness in institutional settings. The Health Department helps places such as hospitals, long-term care homes and retirement homes manage and prevent outbreaks.

## **COVID-19 Testing**

#### Test-to-Treat Approach

- COVID-19 test eligibility (rapid antigen testing and PCR testing) has been updated to align with COVID-19 treatment eligibility
- **High-risk settings (includes LTCH & Hospitals)** 
  - Ongoing access to testing for clinical and outbreak management

#### **Community**

- Only people who are eligible for COVID-19 treatment are eligible for testing (i.e. symptomatic individuals who are immunocompromised, 65 years or older, or have high-risk medical conditions)
- Testing can be accessed through primary care and pharmacies



















### COVID-19 and Influenza Vaccines

- As of October 28, 2024, Influenza and COVID-19 KP.2 vaccines have been available to the general public who are six months of age and older
- Priority populations were vaccinated earlier in the season
- Available at select pharmacies and primary care providers
- Health Department appointments available for children 6 months to 4 years of age having difficulty accessing the vaccines
- Primary Care Outreach Program continues to offer vaccines to people who are homeless and underhoused



















### **RSV Vaccine**

- **High-Risk Older Adult Program (Abrysvo)** 
  - Adults 60 years and older who are residents of LTCH/RH/Elder care lodges, hospitalized ALC patients, those receiving dialysis, transplant recipients
- Those who received an RSV vaccine last year do not require one this season
- Those 60 years of age and older, but not eligible for the publicly funded vaccine, may purchase it at a pharmacy
- Infant and High-Risk Children Program (Beyfortus)
  - All infants as well as high-risk children up to 24 months of age
