Reference Motions

- Motion Protecting Canadian Values: Ban the Nazi Swastika in Canada passed in Durham Region Council on 12th February 2025 - <u>Item 8.2</u>
- Motion Protecting Canadian Values: Ban the Nazi Swastika in Canada passed in Whitby City Council
 on 3rd February 2025 <u>Item 11.2</u>
- We understand the intent here was to address growing antisemitism in Canada, and the sign rereferred here was Nazi Hakenkruez or Nazi Hooked cross; but using the words like "Nazi swastika" is not acceptable to minority Jain, and Hindu Canadians.
- We stand in solidarity with Jewish community and fully support all the efforts by the authorities to address growing antisemistism in Canada, but we object to usage of the word Swastika in hate context and we object to associate swastika word with Nazi.



Swastika – Extensively Used in Jain and Hindu Prayers

Swastika is a Sanskrut word which means well being of all. It is also used when we offer flowers to our God during our prayers at the start of worshipping rituals. The word is very auspicious and used extensively in various ceremonies, multiple times.

Hindu Prayer

Many Jain and Hindu parents keep their children name as Swastika. Also name their business as Swastika.



Swastika – Is There Relationship to Nazi / AntiSemitism?

- Swastika word has no relation to Latin or any of it's derivative European languages.
- Hitler or Nazi never used the word Swastika. They used the word Hakenkruez (in German) or Hooked Cross (in English).
- Holocaust was carried under Nazi Hakenkruez (or Hooked Cross) banner.
- It was New York Times first time associating Swastika word with Nazi with malicious intent to accuse Hindu civilization as an influencing factor for Hitler's actions
- Later the usage of "Nazi Swastika" words was amplified by media with malicious intent towards Hindu civilization.



Impact of Using Swastika word in Hate Context Or Associating Swastik with Nazi

- Deprives Jain and Hindu Canadians their religious rights to use their most auspicious word in their prayers.
- Deprives Jain and Hindu Canadians their religious rights to name their children and business with Swastika name.
- Make Jain and Hindu Canadians vulnerable for legal actions and unnecessary harassments despite having no involvement in antisemitic or hate activities.
- Confuses Jain and Hindu Canadian children about understanding their religious scriptures and worshipping.




Corrections Made in The West - 1

- Bill <u>c-229</u> drafted in Canada's parliament in February 2022 to include certain signs and symbols in Canada's criminal code. This draft bill earlier used the word "Nazi swastika".
- When honorable MP Peter Julian had presented bill c-229 for the first reading in Canada's parliament, Hindu community met and discussed with the MP, to which he had committed to amend Bill C-229 by replacing the word "Nazi swastika" with "Nazi hooked cross". Though the bill did not come to the parliament floor for further consideration and did not become law yet. Our email exchanges with the MP can be provided upon request.



Corrections Made in The West - 2

 Peel Region Police replaced the word "swastika" with "Nazi hate symbol" in the context of hate on their website.

Statement in Canadian Parliament on Swastika on Feb 28, 2022

Mr. Speaker,

On behalf of over one million Canadians of several religious faiths and in particular Hindu-Canadians and as a Hindu-Canadian myself, I call upon members of this house and all Canadians to distinguish between the Hindu religious sacred symbol Swastika and the Nazi symbol of hatred called Hakenkreuz in German or the hooked cross in English.

In the ancient Indian language of Sanskrit, Swastika means "that which brings good luck and well-being."

This ancient and greatly auspicious symbol of the Hindu religion continues to be used today at our Hindu temples, in our religious and cultural rituals, entrances to our homes and in our daily life.

Please stop calling the Nazi symbol of hatred as Swastika.

We support the ban of the Nazi symbol of hatred Hakenkreuz or the hooked cross.

But calling it Swastika is to deny us Hindu-Canadians our religious right and freedom to use our sacred symbol Swastika in our daily life.

It is against the law to intentionally display a Nazi symbol or perform a Nazi gesture in public.

The Nazi Hakenkreuz has been banned in public since 29 December 2022.

The Hakenkreuz is the most widely known Nazi symbol. It has become a symbol of the Nazi Party and its heinous crimes against humanity.

The Victorian Government has expanded this ban to include other symbols and gestures used by the Nazi Party and its paramilitary organisations.

Displaying Nazi symbols or performing Nazi gestures in public can be harmful. The hatred that these symbols and gestures represent is not tolerated in Victoria's multicultural and democratic society.

The exceptions for the cultural and historical significance of the Swastika to Hindu, Buddhist, Jain and other faith communities remain unchanged.

It is not against the law to publicly display the Swastika (which may be mistaken for the Nazi Hakenkreuz symbol) for genuine cultural or religious purposes.

he Swastika, Whirling Log, & other cultural & religious uses are not the same as the Nazi hakenkreuz'

ACCURATE LANGUAGE HELPS BUILD UNDERSTANDING

Clarify for students both the connotations and denotations of the term "Swastika".

While the hooked cross image is commonly referred to as a 'swastika,' the actual Nazi and Neo-Nazi symbol is correctly labeled as a 'hakenkreuz', the German word for 'hooked cross'. Connect the dots through education and clarification about the terminology.

Denotation: 'Swastika' is a Sanskrit word and is used to symbolize auspiciousness and elements of the natural world in many religions and cultures, including in Hinduism, Buddhism, Judaism, Jainism, and some Native American religions and cultures.

Connotation: The association with racism and the Holocaust was a corruption by the Nazi party. Neo-Nazi use of this symbol is intended to intimidate specific communities. (Footnote: See ESB Guidance "Symbols of Hate" for additional information)

2. NAZI SYMBOLISM ISN'T LIMITED TO THE HAKENKREUZ.

Salutes, alpha-numeric codes, and other symbols are also used to convey hate. "Heil Hilter" salute, SS hand sign and bolts, "Camp Auschwitz," "88," "6MWNE," "Blut und Ehre," some runes, and others can be found at the adl.org database.







3. LEARN AND RESEARCH IN ORDER TO ATTEND TO IMPACT.

What can you find out online or from students? Hate symbols can change and enter into culture frequently. Students and others may be able to shed light on the meaning, meme, or cultural issue that is causing harm. If a student is using a symbol that has caused harm, ask about their intentions and understanding in order to educate and have dialog.





Corrections Made in The West - 7

- We have connected with Mr. Richard Robertson from B'naiBrith Canada who had earlier made delegations and requested for the original motions in Whitby City Council and Durham Region Council. Mr. Robertson has acknowledged the issue and impact of using the word "Nazi Swastika", and expressed his apologies to us.
- B'naiBrith Canada is now committed not to use "Nazi Swastika" going forward.
- B'naiBrith Canada will be issuing formal press release in this matter soon.



Requests

- Amend the Motion 8.2 (Durham Council Feb 12, 2025) to replace the word "Nazi Swastika" with "Nazi Hakenkruez" or "Nazi Hooked Cross" or "Nazi symbol of hatred"
- Amend the Motion 11.2 (Whitby City Council Feb 3rd 2025) to replace the word "Nazi Swastika" with "Nazi Hakenkruez" or "Nazi Hooked Cross" or "Nazi symbol of hatred"
- Issue a Press Release about the amended motions and educate people not to use Swastika word in hate context.
- Issue a notification to Durham Region Police Department to update their earlier communications with reference to Swastika
